SPORT ENGLAND NATIONAL ACCREDITATION - CLUB MARK

Sport England **Clubmark** is used by national governing bodies of sport (NGBs) as part of their club accreditation programmes for sports clubs with junior sections in recognition of a quality club. Basically the kitemark of sports clubs. **Kitemark** is the world's premier symbol of trust, integrity and quality. Make your club the best it can be!

Please note that Sport England Clubmark is only awarded through national governing bodies of sport in the case of tennis this is the Lawn Tennis Association and is not awarded by Sport England to individual clubs.

By creating a single, national standard, Clubmark helps give all kinds of sports clubs with a junior section a structure and direction that will benefit them in several ways:

Increasing membership

Being able to demonstrate that you have addressed issues such as equality and child protection gives confidence to parents choosing a club for their children.

Developing your club

The foundation for any club is its youth structure. So, by encouraging and attracting young members, you are building a strong future for your club.

Developing your coaches and volunteers

As part of the accreditation scheme, you'll be given help and advice in developing the skills of everyone involved in your club.

Raising your club's profile

Once accredited, your club will be listed on the national database and in other sporting directories that will help you attract new members and to grow.

Clubmark complements the LTA's vision for tennis clubs. The accreditation process is a supported one and your local LTA Club Development Officer will walk you through it every step of the way. This includes club visits to assist in the improvement of different aspects of the club. Your club may already be meeting Clubmark standards so why not tell your current and potential membership about how good you are!

TRAIN TO BECOME A REFEREE – HELP YOURSELF TO HELP TENNIS

Could you organise a small local tournament? As with most things these days there is a computer programme that does all the paper work for you! As a referee you will be PAID for your work!

The referee's job at a professional tournament is very different to that at a local grassroots competition, but in both cases the referee organises the draw and order of play and makes decisions on any rules issues that arise.

The first step to becoming a referee is to attend a one-day introductory seminar. These seminars are held around the country throughout the year and are free to attend. **Please see the back page for training sessions in the county.**

At the end of the seminar, you will be invited to join the Association of British Tennis Officials (ABTO) and become a trainee referee, which will enable you to work at club or county-level tournaments with an accredited referee. The next step is to pass a one-day free to attend LTA accreditation course, which will allow you to referee LTA-sanctioned tournaments. GLOUCESTERSHIRE PLAYERS TRAINING TO WIN

Sixteen boy's from clubs around Gloucestershire took to the courts recently in the first of 3 planned Matchplay events being held at Cheltenham Ladies College. These competitive but fun tournament's give youngsters the opportunity to compete against players from other clubs around the county. Each player has a LTA rating and will play a minimum of two matches against players of a similar standard.

The first tournament was a massive success with one match seeing a result of 7-6 6-7 10-7 (champions tiebreak). In nearly 30 degree heat the boys showed that their training had prepared them well.

Rob Dearing LTA Club Development Officer said of the event 'its great to see kids getting the opportunity to compete in the county and putting their training into practice'.

A huge thank you must go to Adam Newton who worked with the county LTA to organise the event and ran the operation on the day! Well done Adam!

CASC - MAKE YOUR CLUBS MONEY WORK HARDER!

Are you a sports club who can claim money back from the Inland Revenue?

The community amateur sports club (CASC) system, which came into operation in April 1992, is run by the Inland Revenue Sports Clubs Department.

It seeks to recognise the good community work that many sports clubs do by giving them many of the benefits that derive from having charitable status but **without** the hard work and complexity of enrolling as a charity and complying with charitable procedures.

The main benefits are:-

- 80% rate relief is mandatory and clubs already receiving rate relief are likely in many cases to be able to claim 100 per cent rate relief.
- Under the Gift Aid scheme, clubs can claim back the equivalent of 28p for every £1 donated by a tax payer.
- Tax paid on bank interest can be claimed back.
- Various exemptions from Corporation tax.
- No club can be worse off by being a registered CASC.

Registration is easy - you just have to complete two simple forms and submit a set of accounts and your governing documents. You will find these two documents by following the link below. If after you fill out these documents you are not compliant with the CASC system, the Inland Revenue will even advise you what changes need to be made.

To qualify, sport must be one of your club's constitution's main objectives. And usual funding agency stipulations apply, for example, membership must be open to all, club profits must be invested back into club activities, on dissolution of the club etc

COACH CONTACT TIME

LTA RATINGS - ONE FOR THE PARENTS!

An LTA Player Rating is a way of measuring your tennis ability, so you can see how you are improving. It also means you can make sure you are entering the right standard of competitions. It's a bit like a golf handicap.

Having a rating does not mean everything has to get scary and serious! Many players around the country play for fun and enjoy seeing their rating rise. Other players look to improve their rating so they can enter bigger and better tournaments!

If you don't have a rating go to www.lta.org.uk, click Play and Compete then Membership then Join and then Junior Player or Adult Player it costs £3 for a junior and £6 for an adult. <u>IT'S EASY</u>!

COMPETITIONS AND COURSES

MORE TOURNAMENTS NEEDED

As you can see from the previous page we need to create more competitive opportunities for players in Gloucestershire.

We want our players to train to compete and not train to train and the only way to do this is to provide them with the opportunity to play in tournaments in our local area.

As a county we will be organising a series of Winter Matchplay events along with other events being planned at the moment. Our goal is to provide regular competitive opportunities for our players across the county.

To make this a success we need the help of many of you around the county. You are the marketing team of Gloucestershire Tennis and all you have to do to keep this status is print out tournament schedules and forms when they are sent through to you, promote all the events to your club members and players on your coaching programmes. We need your help!

A quality tournament schedule in Gloucestershire will only succeed if we have players entering the tournaments regularly. This is where the Clubs and Coaches come in. Please promote new tournaments when they are sent through to you.

We will also be developing a simple piece of literature to help you make sense of the competitive structure in the UK. Watch this space for more info!

As a Club, Coach or Parent you can organise very simple competitions that can last from a few hours to a week but the simplest ones to run do not last longer than a half a day to a day.

All you have to do is provide a venue. Then you decide whether you want to run it yourselves, a great way to make money for the club / coach or let someone else run it, for example the county or an independent tournament organiser.

The gualified referee who operates the event on the day takes care of everything to do with the tournament.

16 players paying £8.50 = £136 less £20 balls less £70 referee = £46 profit for club or coach before any drinks or snacks you might sell on the day. To find out more about running tournaments at your club or venue please contact the county office.
